## Fulbright Program

The Fulbright Program, founded in 1946, is a global academic exchange initiative of the U.S. government aimed at fostering mutual understanding and promoting friendly, peaceful relations between the United States and other nations. Partnering with over 160 countries, it offers a wide range of fellowships and scholarships. In 49 countries, including Thailand, independent binational Fulbright Commissions administer the Fulbright Program with support from local governments.

Beyond teaching, they engage in campus life, join communities, and grow both personally and professionally. By the end of their journey, FLTAs return home as confident educators, skilled communicators, and cultural ambassadors, ready to foster greater understanding and build lasting global connections.

## FLTA at a Glance

**Purpose:** Thai language and culture teaching and graduate course enrollment at a U.S. university  
**Applicant:** English teachers at public secondary schools/universities. Perfect for early-career educators.  
**Number of Grant:** Up to 6 annually  
**Grant Period:** 9 months  
**Application Period:** March-June

## Program Uniqueness

- Binational scholarship supported by the Thai and U.S. governments
- Teach Thai language at U.S. university while refining your teaching skills
- Take graduate courses to advance your professional growth
- Strengthen English and experience American work and life culture first-hand
- Share Thai language and culture through classes, clubs, and events

## Eligibility

- Thai citizens, aged 21-35 years old
- English teacher at a Thai university or secondary school (early-career preferred)
- Bachelor's degree from Thai university
- Valid TOEFL iBT 79+, IELTS 6+, or Duolingo 115\*
- Little or no prior U.S. experience preferred

*\*Duolingo English Test scores are accepted for the application stage only. If you are shortlisted for the next stage, you will be required to submit an official score report from the TOEFL iBT, meeting the program's minimum requirement.*



## Required Documents

- Resume/CV
- 3 letters of recommendation (submitted online directly by recommenders)
- Valid passport or national ID
- Official diplomas and transcripts of all post-secondary education
- English proficiency score report

## Grant Benefits

- Monthly stipend
- Tuition waivers for required courses
- J-1 visa sponsorship
- Round-trip international economy airfare
- Accident and sickness insurance coverage

## Selection Criteria

- Leadership skills and ability to inspire students
- Passion for teaching Thai language and culture
- Eagerness to engage in campus and community life
- Creative, independent, and a team player
- Strong interpersonal skills
- Ability to represent Thailand effectively in their field and serve as a Thai cultural ambassador

## Grant Timeline

### Application year

- March-June — Application period
- July — Interview
- August — Interview result

### Following year

- May — Matching result with U.S. Host institutions
- June — Pre-departure orientation
- August-September — Grant begins
